Heaton Stannington - a history

Although officially founded in 1910, Heaton Stannington were in existence by 1903 and playing at Miller's Lane on the site of the current Fossway. The club name originates from its links with the Stannington Avenue area of Heaton.



In 1903-04 they finished fifth in division 2 of the Newcastle and District Amateur League. In December 1904, they resigned from the league with the reserves also appearing to have resigned from the Northern Amateur League (NAL) and there is no further record of the team until 1910. This suggests that they might have folded and then reformed nearly six years later. The summer of 1910 saw Heaton Stannington field a cricket team. The next football match played by the Stan appears to have been on 24th September 1910 when they were beaten 4-1 by Sandyford.

From at least 1913, home games were taking place at Paddy Freeman's Park. The club played friendly matches until joining the Tyneside Minor League in 1913 and NAL Division Two in 1914. The club were elected to membership of the Northumberland FA (NFA) on 10 September 1914, just over a month after the start of the First World War. The Stan stopped playing until 1919 as at a NFA emergency meeting on 24 November 1914 it was announced that the club were unable to take part in a Minor cup replay 'on account of not being able to raise a team as so many of their members had joined the army.'

The club spent the next 19 years in NAL Division One and gained their first trophies in 1934 and 1936 when they won the Tynemouth Infirmary Minor Cup and NAL Challenge Cup respectively. The first glory season came in 1936-37 when the club won NAL Division One, were Northumberland Amateur Cup winners and NAL Challenge Cup runners up. The reserves were also NAL Division Two runners up. For one season, 1938-39, the Stan participated in the Tyneside League and were runners up. By the 1930s the team were playing at the Coast Road ground. In October 1935, they started playing at Newton Park in High Heaton on the site of a recently filled-in quarry. In 2007, the ground was renamed Grounsell Park in honour of the service given, both on and off the pitch, by Bob Grounsell.

One of the most memorable matches played there took place in July 2012 when Heaton Stannington were beaten 4-0 by the Gabon national side. This warm-up match for the Olympics included an appearance by Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang.

The club were elected to the Northern League in 1939. They only managed one season in the league before it was suspended for the duration of the Second World War. The league restarted in 1945 but Heaton Stannington were elected, until 1946, as a non-playing member as their ground was being used by the military. After 5 consecutive bottom three finishes, the club resigned at the end of the 1951-52 season and joined the Northern Alliance until 1956.



The next 16 seasons included involvement in the NAL (1956-59), North Eastern League (1959-60) and the Northern Combination (1960-72). In 1972 the club stepped up to the Wearside League and remained there for ten years. They were forced to resign from the league in 1982 for financial reasons due to the club trustees, who had formed a limited company in 1968, putting the annual rent up from £400 to £1500.

The company then tried to build a supermarket on the ground but the planning application was defeated. In 1983 the High Court ruled that the ground belonged to the football club and the company had to relinquish ownership. The team played in the Tyneside Amateur League (TAL) during 1982-83 as Heaton United. Back as Heaton Stannington, they won the TAL in 1983-84 which was only their second league title up to this point. The next 2 seasons were spent back in the NAL where they were champions in 1985-86 as well as winning the Northumberland Minor Cup and the C&E Injections Service Shield.



For the next 27 years the club were in the Northern Alliance, which became a 3-tier league in 1988 and saw the Stan placed in the Premier Division. After two relegations to Division One, the Stan achieved stability by spending 9 seasons in the Premier Division. The club won their highest level league trophy when they became Champions in 2012. In 2012-13, they achieved the treble by not only retaining the title but by also winning the Northern Alliance League Cup and the Northumberland Senior Benevolent Bowl.

From 1911 to the financial crisis of 1982, the club had a competitive reserve team. It played much of the inter war years in the North Eastern Amateur League before rejoining the NAL on and off for nearly fifty years but with a five-year spell in the 1960s, including two runners up spots, in the TAL. The club had an 'A' and 'B' team for 2016-17 before these teams reverted back to their previous name of Newcastle Chemfica. The Stan continue to have a successful over 40's side.

For season 2013-14, after a gap of 61 years, the Stan returned to the Northern League. They were in the promotion race throughout the season and finished fifth. In their second season back, they finished ninth and qualified for the FA Cup for the first time in 39 years. Season 2015-16 saw the Stan again finish ninth and they also reached the semi-final of the Northumberland Senior Cup against Blyth Spartans. In the league there was a memorable 3-2 home win over champions South Shields. In 2016-17, the Stan surprised many by just missing out on promotion in the 2nd last game of the season, coming fourth after winning 11 games in a row starting in January. In 2017-18 they were again in the promotion race until the second last match, ending fifth. Last season after a slow start the Stan put an incredible run of wins together, ultimately finishing the season in 4th.

Since the club gained promotion to the Northern League, improvements have been made to Grounsell Park including floodlights, a stand and a new terracing. These complement the existing facilities which include a bar serving real ale with the club being voted CAMRA Tyneside club of 2018 and 2020. Much of the recent success is a result of the commitment and work of manager Derek Thompson along with the support of an increasingly large band of volunteers known as the **Stan Army**.

Heaton Stannington 0-3 Hebburn Town 4th Aug 2020 - Pre Season Friendly

They say that bad things come in threes and tonight was the just that for the Stan in their first match of the new pre-season and also their first one post covid lockdown- The weather was miserable, there were no fans as matches currently have to be played behind closed doors and they got beat by FA Vase semi-finalists. Although Hebburn were the better side, the Stan tried to play and there were lots of optimistic signs for future matches especially with a larger and more match fit squad. There was some good news as, the day before, the Stan had been drawn to appear in the 20-21 FA Cup. This will be 100 years on from their first appearance.

On an almost perfect pitch, Hebburn started on the attack and immediately shot over the bar. Hebburn continued to have most of the ball and shot wide from a corner after 4 minutes. The Stan's 1st attack in 7 minutes saw Campbell blocked before he could shoot and a minute later the Stan shot wide. Hebburn took the lead after 10 minutes when, from a corner, Ball punched the ball towards his own net and a high foot from Stoddart helped it over the line. The Stan didn't give up and Paterson made a run but in 14 minutes Hoggins, who was playing in defence, headed towards his own goal from a Hebburn corner but Ball managed to clear. The Stan attacked again, initially through Campbell, and an Imray free kick through a crowded box was dropped by Foden in the Hebburn goal but Blackbourne couldn't get a rebound shot in. There was then 5 minutes of sustained Hebburn pressure culminating in a 2nd goal for the visitors after 22 minutes. A corner ball into the box was hit against the bar and then was headed into the net by Graeme Armstrong. It was mainly Hebburn for the next few minutes as they came close to scoring again twice. The Stan got an attack in 32 minutes but Deagle was blocked. This was followed by Hebburn attacking and Blackbourne slipping when trying to clear but Ball blocked with his feet. He then saved from a corner. Another poor clearance saw Hebburn shoot over. The Stan then got forward again but Campbell was blocked. In 40 minutes, Hebburn hit the bar from a free kick on the edge of the box and Ball made a great save punching away the rebound header. The half finished with another Hebburn attack but Ball did well to block the ball from the resulting corner.

As the 2nd half went on some more switching took place between the outfield players with Hebburn doing likewise. Overall, the 2nd half was quieter but Hebburn had most of the early possession. The 1st clear attack of the 2nd half though came for the Stan after 50 minutes when Fodden had to clear. The Stan got their 1st corner 3 minutes later but it was easily cleared. A Hebburn shot was then blocked by Bailey and the ball from the resulting corner was blocked by Ball. The Stan countered through Robinson but he was blocked and he then crossed. In 56 minutes, Ball caught a free kick. The visitors then shot from within the box but it was deflected for a corner from which Town eventually shot over. Campbell then shot wide. In 63 minutes another Hebburn corner was cleared off the line. Almost immediately, a great long shot from Ollie Martin on the left went straight into the top right hand corner for 0-3. Hebburn had another long shot from a free kick 3 minutes later but it went wide. There was a rare Stan attack in 75 minutes and 2 minutes later Hebburn shot over. 2 minutes after that and Ball made a fantastic double save. He then blocked again soon after. In 83 minutes Robinson was brought down just outside the box but his free kick went well over the wall and bar. Foden had to clear a Stan shot soon after before Ball had to save at the other end. Robinson then headed wide from a Canham cross before Ball had to save again. The Stan attacked again but in 88 minutes Hebburn had the ball in the net although it was offside.

North Shields Club History

North Shields Athletic was originally formed in 1896, and played initially in the South Shields & District league. They progressed through the Northern Combination, Northern Alliance and North Eastern League and became a major force in North East Football, outside the Football League, moving to play at Hawkey's Lane around 1900. The originally joined the Northern Alliance, before switching to the North Eastern League in 1908. Spells in the Midland League and Northern Counties league followed before the club joined the Northern league in the 1964-65 season, finishing third at their first attempt.

The Robins moment of crowning glory came in 1969, when they won the FA Amateur Cup by beating Sutton United in front of 47,000 spectators at Wembley Stadium. Shields were a goal down after only four minutes but won with second half strikes from Richie Hall and Brian Joicey – both laid on by Orrick, a shipyard worker from Byker. The club, which also won the Northern League title and Challenge Cup that same year, were declared joint holders of the European Amateur Cup the following season when two games against Italian Side Almas resulted in a level aggregate score.

Having moved into the national pyramid by joining the NCEL in 1989, North Shields earned promotion to the Northern Premier League by winning the title in 1992. However, financial problems arose, which meant Appleby Park had to be sold to and lead to the club folding. However, they almost instantly reformed as a new club, thanks to the efforts of local people and many of the current committee.

The club, headed by new chairman Richard Slade, sought and gained immediate admission to the Second Division of the Wearside League. They were promoted to the top flight as runners-up in their first season, briefly reverting back to North Shields Athletic for four seasons. They enjoyed success in local cup competitions, too, the Shipowners Cup and NFA Senior Bowl added to that title in 1998/99 treble-winning season.

In 1999, the club moved to Ralph Gardner Park, now known as the Daren Persson Stadium, and began to develop the ground to meet the Northern League standards. Once again known as North Shields FC, the club began to kick on, league runners-up in 2000/01 and winners by eight points the following season. They also continued to collect silverware elsewhere, winning the Monkwearmouth Charity Cup in 2001 and again in 2003. After a fifteen-year absence, the Robins gained promotion back into the Northern League in 2004 following their third Wearside League title and a further Shipowners Cup triumph.

After ten years in Division Two, the club belatedly returned to the top tier having narrowly missed out in 2010/11. The Robins shattered records en route to the 2013/14 championship including the Daren Persson Stadium attendance which was 1,312 for the visit of West Allotment Celtic and the presentation of the 2nd division trophy.

But better was to come as the Robins swept past the likes of Phoenix Sports, Erith & Belvedere and Highworth Town to reach the 2015 FA Vase final at Wembley. In front of almost 10,000 fans, Shields went behind to Glossop North End, but a late equaliser by Gareth Bainbridge and Adam Forster's extra-time finish clinched the coveted trophy for Graham Fenton's men. The club also finished fourth in division one to cap a memorable season.

Brian Smith left the club in February 2018 to be replaced by ex Whitley Bay boss Marc Nash. Nash brought with him Anthony Woodhouse who was welcomed back to his old stamping ground as assistant.

The duo marked their debut in charge with a sensational 6-5 victory over Jarrow Roofing after the Robins were trailing 5-2 late in the game. With Steve Swinyard coming in as coach the new management team guided the club to a final 8th position as the season closed.

Newcastle Benfield 4-0 Heaton Stannington 15th August 2020 - Pre Season Friendly

Although they are situated only about a mile apart, this was the 1st time the Stan and Benfield had played each other since 2002. Unfortunately, it was without the Stan Army as again the Stan's 2nd pre-season friendly was played behind closed doors. The score made it look like the Stan were well beaten but the result was down to an unfortunate 10-minute spell in the 1st half when Benfield scored 3 goals.

Until the 1st goal after 27 minutes, neither team had looked threatening. The Stan had a free kick cleared after 4 minutes and, after 2 attacks were cleared, Benfield shot wide from a long-range effort after 8 minutes. The next 10 minutes saw 2 attacks from both sides easily cleared. After 21 minutes, the trialist replaced the injured Canham. The Stan were increasing the pressure although nothing was given when Campbell was fouled after 24 minutes. Regan then caught a Benfield free kick followed by the Stan shooting wide. Against the recent run of play, Benfield scored in 27 minutes when the ball was sent into a crowded Stan box and O'Reilly blasted it high through the crowd and into the net. The Stan attacked but in 30 minutes the ball was sent down the left and crossed into O'Reilly again who slotted past Regan for 2-0. In 32 minutes, it looked like Benfield had scored again but the ball hit the side netting. In 35 minutes, a great ball into the box by Simpson was caught by the home keeper. 2 minutes later a Benfield attack was blocked but Grayson managed to pass in the box to Giroud who made it 3-0 after Regan had parried and when the defence should have blocked. Campbell soon after shot well wide and a Benfield attack was cleared. A Stan attack was then easily cleared before Robinson cleared a home attack before another Benfield effort was also cleared. The trialist then supplied Campbell who looked like he was going to score but his effort was deflected for a corner which was also cleared before the trialist's long shot went wide.

The 2nd half started with Bailey and new signing Basham, who made a very positive debut, replacing Waters and Robinson. The Stan started the half positively, with Mason working hard, although a joined-up attack in the 47 minute came to nothing. In 52 minutes Callum Wells, who was playing as a trialist but has now signed, replaced the injured Balackbourne at centre half. The Stan then attacked followed by a quiet spell when both sides only attacked once. The Stan's best chance so far came in 59 minutes when the trialist passed into the box and Basham's flick was put only just saved by the keeper. From the resulting corner, Basham's shot was caught by the keeper. The Stan put more pressure on but in 62 minutes Regan had to get down to stop a Benfield shot. The Stan then had 2 attacks with the 2nd seeing the trialist passing to Campbell but although blocked Bailey got the ball but shot wide. In 66 minutes, a Miller free kick was sent into a crowded box to Bailey but the keeper caught from his header. The home side attacked before a Stan attack was blocked and a 2nd attack was wasted. Benfield then attacked twice. In 74 minutes, good work by Campbell but his eventual effort was easily caught by the keeper. Benfield countered, won a free kick but then shot over the bar after an initial clearance. Benfield attacked again and after a 4 minute quiet period a Basham shot, which was going slightly wide, just failed to be intercepted by Campbell in the 6 yard box. Wells then cleared a Benfield attack before a Simpson ball into the Benfield box was easily caught. In 81 minutes, Benfield attacked down the right and a short pass to O'Reilly saw him clinically shoot past the Stan defence to his hat-trick & Benfield's 4th. Benfield then had a similar effort on the left but Regan blocked. In 85 minutes, Robinson came back on for Campbell. Regan made a good block with his feet 2 minutes later when it should have been Benfield's 5th goal. The match ended with some Stan pressure, but it was too late.
