Heaton Stannington - a history

Although officially founded in 1910, Heaton Stannington were in existence by 1903 and playing at Miller's Lane on the site of the current Fossway. The club name originates from its links with the Stannington Avenue area of Heaton.



In 1903-04 they finished fifth in division 2 of the Newcastle and District Amateur League. In December 1904, they resigned from the league with the reserves also appearing to have resigned from the Northern Amateur League (NAL) and there is no further record of the team until 1910. This suggests that they might have folded and then reformed nearly six years later. The summer of 1910 saw Heaton Stannington field a cricket team. The next football match played by the Stan appears to have been on 24th September 1910 when they were beaten 4-1 by Sandyford.

From at least 1913, home games were taking place at Paddy Freeman's Park. The club played friendly matches until joining the Tyneside Minor League in 1913 and NAL Division Two in 1914. The club were elected to membership of the Northumberland FA (NFA) on 10 September 1914, just over a month after the start of the First World War. The Stan stopped playing until 1919 as at a NFA emergency meeting on 24 November 1914 it was announced that the club were unable to take part in a Minor cup replay 'on account of not being able to raise a team as so many of their members had joined the army.'

The club spent the next 19 years in NAL Division One and gained their first trophies in 1934 and 1936 when they won the Tynemouth Infirmary Minor Cup and NAL Challenge Cup respectively. The first glory season came in 1936-37 when the club won NAL Division One, were Northumberland Amateur Cup winners and NAL Challenge Cup runners up. The reserves were also NAL Division Two runners up. For one season, 1938-39, the Stan participated in the Tyneside League and were runners up. By the 1930s the team were playing at the Coast Road ground. In October 1935, they started playing at Newton Park in High Heaton on the site of a recently filled-in quarry. In 2007, the ground was

renamed Grounsell Park in honour of the service given, both on and off the pitch, by Bob Grounsell.

One of the most memorable matches played there took place in July 2012 when Heaton Stannington were beaten 4-0 by the Gabon national side. This warm-up match for the Olympics included an appearance by Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang.

The club were elected to the Northern League in 1939. They only managed one season in the league before it was



suspended for the duration of the Second World War. The league restarted in 1945 but Heaton Stannington were elected, until 1946, as a non-playing member as their ground was being used by the military. After 5 consecutive bottom three finishes, the club resigned at the end of the 1951-52 season and joined the Northern Alliance until 1956.

The next 16 seasons included involvement in the NAL (1956-59), North Eastern League (1959-60) and the Northern Combination (1960-72). In 1972 the club stepped up to the Wearside League and remained there for ten years. They were forced to resign from the league in 1982 for financial reasons due to the club trustees, who had formed a limited company in 1968, putting the annual rent up from £400 to £1500.

The company then tried to build a supermarket on the ground but the planning application was defeated. In 1983 the High Court ruled that the ground belonged to the football club and the company had to relinquish ownership. The team played in the Tyneside Amateur League (TAL) during 1982-83 as Heaton United. Back as Heaton Stannington, they won the TAL in 1983-84 which was only their second league title up to this point. The next 2 seasons were spent back in the NAL where they were champions in 1985-86 as well as wining the Northumberland Minor Cup and the C&E Injections Service Shield.



For the next 27 years the club were in the Northern Alliance. After two relegations to Division One, the Stan achieved stability by spending 9 seasons in the Premier Division. The club won their highest level league trophy when they became Champions in 2012. In 2012-13, they achieved the treble by not only retaining the title but by also winning the Northern Alliance League Cup and the Northumberland Senior Benevolent Bowl.

From 1911 to the financial crisis of 1982, the club had a competitive reserve team. It played

much of the inter war years in the North Eastern Amateur League before rejoining the NAL on and off for nearly fifty years but with a five-year spell in the 1960s, including two runners up spots, in the TAL. The club had an 'A' and 'B' team for 2016-17 before these teams reverted back to their previous name of Newcastle Chemfica. A reserve side was re -established in 2019and they play in the Northern Alliance 4th tier development league. In their first season, they reached the final of the Neville Cowey Cup.

For season 2013-14, after a gap of 61 years, the Stan returned to the Northern League. They were in the promotion race throughout the season and finished 5th. They then finished 9th and qualified for the FA Cup for the first time in 39 years. Season 2015-16 saw the Stan again finish 9th and they also reached the semi-final of the Northumberland Senior Cup against Blyth Spartans. In 2016-17, the Stan surprised many by just missing out on promotion in the 2nd last game of the season, coming 4th after winning 11 games in a row starting in January. In 2017-18 & 2018-19 they were again in the promotion race until the 2nd last match, ending 5th and 4th respectively. Due to covid, the 19-20 season was declared null & void with the Stan still challenging for promotion in 5th place after 28 games. Last season was also abandoned with the Stan in 11th place having played 12 games.

Since the club gained promotion to the Northern League, improvements have been made to Grounsell Park including floodlights, a stand and a new terracing. These complement the existing facilities which include a bar serving real ale with the club being voted CAMRA Tyneside club of 2018 and 2020. Much of the success was due to Derek Thompson, manager 2002-21, along with the support of an increasingly large band of volunteers. In June, Dekka stepped down and was replaced by Dean Nicholson.

Redcar Town 3-0 Heaton Stannington Northern League Division 2, Saturday 12 March 2022

It was a very sunny but windy and increasingly cold afternoon as the Stan started their 1^{st} match for 10 days in front of a good turnout of the Stan Army, most of whom had travelled on the team coach which was sponsored by Manchester Stan.

The 1st 10 minutes though saw Hopper working well down the left wing. In 12 minutes, Proctor and McAndrew combined well although the eventual resulting corner was caught by Algie in the home goal. There was a good chance for the Stan in 23 minutes when a long ball to McBryde in the box saw his shot blocked by a defender for a corner. Esdaille headed form the corner but Algie caught the ball. Redcar then countered but the Stan defence dealt with it. 3 minutes later and a home long range effort saw Regan down to save. The ball was then sent up the other end to Proctor who hesitated in the box & the ball was put out for a corner from which the ball hit the far post & went out. The most exciting moment of the match so far was when Esdaille cleared the ball out of the pitch & nearly hit a passing car. A joined up attack by McBryde, Holmes & finally Proctor was blocked by Algie. In 32 minutes, the home side came close to scoring when another of their many counter attacks saw them hit the post with a rebound shot being cleared off the line by McAndrew. The Stan then countered themselves through Hopper but Algie blocked his shot. Regan then pulled off a great save after Redcar were given too much room during a joined up attack. The Stan started battling again & a sustained attack in 37 minutes was eventually halted after a great ball into the box by Hornsby. In 42 minutes there was a great run down the wing by Hopper, who was now on the right but his cross into the box was cleared. He was then brought down just outside the box but Stephenson's free kick went well over. In the last minute of the half, a Redcar counter saw the ball come towards Holmes on the edge of the box but he couldn't hold it allowing the home player to advance & cross to Williams for him to slot the ball past Regan.

Ending the 1st half unexpectedly behind did result in the Stan starting the 2nd half on the attack. Both teams continued to try to attack but the Stan's attempts appeared lacklustre at times. Hopper had a shot blocked in 50 minute which was followed by a home counter attack. Esdaille blocked the ball but it fell to Williams who shot past Regan for 2-0. In 56 minutes, a long ball by Stephenson saw Algie handle just outside the box but nothing was given. Burn & Howard came on to freshen things up but to no avail. Regan & Hall combined to halt another home counter attack in 60 minutes. The Stan were losing balls in the middle of the field & could not break through the home defence. In 67 minutes, Burn lost the ball near the half way line & a long ball to El-coate saw him with only Regan to beat & he did, to make it 3-0. A bad tackle on Stephenson saw him having to be replaced by Stoddart. The Stan were 2nd best although a great save by Regan in 80 minutes stopped things getting worse & he had to do so again 3 minutes later. After 2 further minutes he made another great save after Hall had been beaten. The match staggered to an end with the Stan not really threatening.

Billingham Synthonia Club History

Billingham Synthonia FC formed in 1923, first contesting the South Bank & District League, before joining the Teesside League. After the second world war, Synthonia rejoined the Teesside league for a last term before joining the Northern League in 1945-46.

Synthonia played their first Northern League match on the 25th August 1945 with a 5-4 win away at Shildon. After coming third in their inaugural Northern League season & 'Dusty' Rhodes scoring a club record eight goals in a match at South Bank on Christmas Day 1945, Synners went on to become runner-up on three occasions; 49-50, 50-51, 51-52.

A first trophy as Northern Leaguers came in 51-52, winning the Northern League Challenge Cup. A first league title came in 56-57. Billingham also boasted FA Cup runs which saw them face football league sides in the 1st round proper on four occasions before the 60's; Crewe Alexandra in 48-49, Stockport County in 49-50, Scunthorpe in 51-52 and Carlisle United in 56-57, as well as Boston United 57-58.

After being runners-up in the Durham Challenge Cup in 81-82, the club enjoyed a purple patch with a host of league and cup success, despite being relegated to division 2 in 85-86. Promoted back to division 1 at the first attempt in 86-87, the 2nd division title was claimed losing just one league game. The following 87-88 season saw League Cup success over Shildon with a 2-1 win. FA Cup success also returned to the club as they reached the 1st round for a 6th time and a 'home' tie against Halifax Town at Hartlepool United's Victoria Ground. the Shaymen ran out 4-2 winners.

The 88-89 season saw the 1st division title claimed for a second time. A first Durham Challenge Cup success was also obtained with a 4-1 win over neighbours Billingham Town. A third Northern League title was secured in 89-90 and a third League Cup was also claimed in a 5-2 win over Whitby Town. Further FA Cup progression also ensued with a 1st round tie away at Lincoln City where Synners narrowly missed out with a 1-0 defeat at Sincil Bank.

More success in the Durham Challenge Cup followed in 90-91 with a 1-0 win over Eppleton CW. Synthonia were runner-up in the league in 92-93. The following 93-94 season Synners reached the quarter-final of the FA Trophy, a run which included wins over conference sides Kettering Town & Macclesfield Town. Billingham exited after taking Woking to a replay. Another Northern League runner-up came in 94-95. The 95-96 season saw the fourth of Synthonia's Northern League titles. Two further runner-up spots in the league (96-97 & 97-98) came as the century came to a close.

The early part of the new millennium saw Billingham runners-up twice in the Durham Cup (02-03 & 05-06), runners-up in the League Cup (02-03) and a runners-up spot in the Northern League (04-05). The club's best FA Vase run came in the 2006-07 season, reaching the semi-finals only to lose out 5-4 on penalties against AFC Totton

Synners won the Durham Cup in 08-09 with a 1-0 win over Northern Premier League side Durham City, the following 09-10 season retaining the trophy in a 2-0 win over Ryton. Synthonia were promoted back to division one in 2016-17 and were also runner up in the Durham Cup for a 5th time, losing 2-0 to South Shields in the final at Hartlepool's Victoria Park. The club were on the verge of returning to Division 1 before the corona virus pandemic cut short both the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons. They still managed another Durham County Cup Final in 2021 though, losing 2-0 to West Auckland Town. The foundations are in place to secure the club's future with Synthonia now having a football academy, and a development team competing in the 2021-22 season.
